Not Ashamed works with churches and schools in areas of: Discipleship - Evangelism - Religious Education - Collective worship - & more

Not Ashamed is a continually evolving organisation run by Rev Simo, an ordained Anglican minister. Before ordination Rev Simo spent many years in Church based youth and children's work.

Along with his specific work experience he has developed an interest in story telling, circus and illusion, along with other areas of creative arts. These all play a key part in the ministry of Not Ashamed.



We work with churches in several different ways.

As an ordained minister with PTO in the Oxford Diocese, Rev Simo provides cover and support to local churches on Sundays and occasional offices. He also helps out on a contract basis with parishes/benefices/teams for particular projects or support.

As Not Ashamed we offer **Creative Discipleship Workshops** to churches, teams and wider groups ie dioceses.

We can also provide story-based **outreach** events suitable for all ages and finishing with a gospel message.

Again we offer a number of resources for schools.

'**RE Adventure days'** are aimed at KS1 & 2 and give

an opportunity to explore aspects of the Christian faith through fun activities, looking at areas that are fundamental parts of Christianity and form part of the national curriculum. A session lasts an hour and so we can work with 4 groups/classes in a day and we can also provide a collective worship on the same theme as part of that day.

Training for staff as part of inset days or a couple of hours after school. We can help with areas like: *Enter the Story* is an approach to help in the preparation of RE lessons and works as a tool for children to explore Bible stories. *Leading collective/class worship*.

Leading collective/class worship. School/class reflection areas.

Being a learner is a fun session that helps teachers remember what it is like to be a learner/pupil.

We also offer **support/consultancy** to Church Schools around Vision and Values and in the writing or development of statements and policies around being a Church School.

The name Not Ashamed?

When the Apostle Paul writes to the church in Rome he says in 1:16 "I am not ashamed of the Gospel...". The Romans thought that Christianity was something to be ashamed of, Paul writes as a Roman citizen and wants to challenge that belief.
